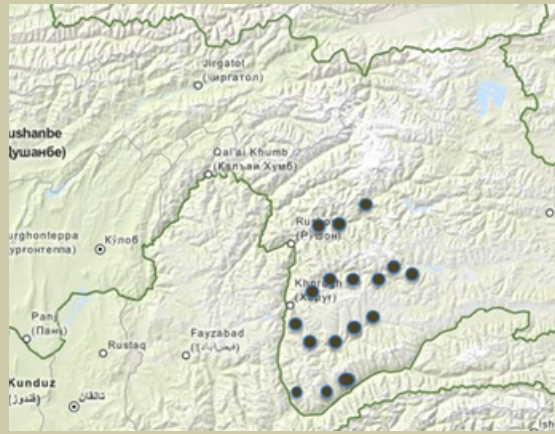

Overview

“CAMP Tabiat” is the Public Organization in Tajikistan and is located in the town of Khorog, the administrative centre of GBAO. The CAMP Tabiat began its activities in January of 2014.

Our Mission

Our mission is to promote the sustainable development of mountain regions (villages) in Tajikistan through the cooperation between partner organizations at the regional and international levels. Our aim is to make a positive contribution to improving the living standards of the rural population of Tajikistan by supporting the sustainable use of natural resources (forests and pastures) and promoting sustainable adaptation of these resources and resource users to the climate change.

Our Purpose

Our aim is to make a positive contribution to improving the living standards of the rural population of Tajikistan by supporting the sustainable use of natural resources (forests and pastures) and promoting sustainable adaptation of these resources and resource users to the climate change.

Our Responsibilities

The organization supports the local population in the mountain regions by promoting sustainable forest management and integrated natural resource management through raising awareness and building capacity among local communities and stakeholders. It focuses on developing and adapting tools for the sustainable use of natural resources, forest restoration, and climate change adaptation, all based on an ecosystem approach. Additionally, the organization works on creating strategies and technologies for sustainable forest management, land resource integration, and equitable distribution.

Our Activities

CAMP Tabiat has implemented several notable projects over the years. These include the Regional Project "Ecosystem Approach for Climate Change Adaptation in High Mountain Regions of Central Asia" (EPAIC) from 2015 to 2020, the Project "Adaptation to Climate Change through Sustainable Forest Management in Key Watersheds of Tajikistan" (CAFT) from 2015 to 2019, and the Regional Program "Sustainable Land Use Considering Climate Change for Economic Development in Central Asia" (SLUCA) from 2018 to 2020. In 2021, the organization carried out the "Afforestation for Disaster Risk Reduction" project, followed by the "Improving the Conservation of Key Migratory Mammal Species in Central Asia through Climate-Informed Management and Decision-Making" project in 2022.
